JIC Job Description

Job Title: Junior Instructor-Counselor (JIC)

Reports To: Instructor-Counselors (IC) during dance classes; Program Director (PD) outside of dance classes

Position Purpose: JICs are primary caregivers for groups of campers and assist ICs in dance classes. JICs plan, choreograph and teach elective dance classes; coordinate and carry out camp activities and guide campers in their personal growth.

Essential Job Functions:

- Assist ICs in teaching 3-5 dance classes a day (Monday – Friday), totaling approximately 4-5 hours of daily dance instruction.** *The core dance techniques offered at ADTC are hip hop, jazz and theatre dance (theatre dance also incorporates basic ballet). Dance elective classes offered can include lyrical, modern, Latin jazz, tap, etc. Dance classes are organized by age and overall ability level across disciplines. Once placed, campers remain within the same group for all dance classes that session. We expect to keep dance classes to no more than 14 students per class. Each class meets daily, but times and locations may vary day- to-day. To determine ability, a “dance screening” takes place each Sunday night (the first night of each session week).*
 - Assistant teach in one dance technique for the duration of each session, assisting the Instructor-Counselor in the direction, supervision and organization of campers of all dance abilities and experience in that discipline.
 - Assist the ICs in each aspect of running a dance class: warm-ups, across-the-floor work, conditioning, combinations, etc.
 - Assist in teaching an original 2-3 minute performance piece to each student group.
 - Assist in teaching a short combination and evaluating small groups of campers during Sunday “dance screening.”
 - Ensure that dance screening and dance classes in general are as non-competitive and encouraging for each camper as possible.
 - Choreograph and teach an elective dance class for campers to perform in the Friday Night Show (*the elective class/es offered during each session depends on the specialties of that week’s JICs*).
- When not assistant teaching dance classes, JICs help out around camp as camp counselors** - assisting in the direction, supervision and organization of campers in their living unit, within activities and throughout the camp.
 - Apply basic youth development principles in working with campers through communication, relationship development, respect for diversity, involvement and empowerment.
 - Assume role as counselor and primary caregiver to small group of assigned campers, helping them with social conflicts, homesickness, personal problems, etc.
 - Assure campers are properly supervised at all times.
 - Be aware of and implement safety guidelines.
 - Work in ADTC’s Canteen (camp store), arts & crafts room, computer lab, etc., as assigned.
- Participate enthusiastically in the development and implementation of program** activities for campers within the mission and outcomes of ADTC (*examples of activities include “American Dance Idol” night, camp fire night, horseback riding, Bromley Thrill Zone field trip, dance discussion, swimming, hiking, arts & crafts, canoeing, field games, flying trapeze and may other activities/events*).
 - Lead or assist with the teaching of day and evening program activities, both camper-mandatory and camper-optional, as assigned by the Program Director.

- Actively participate in all program areas as assigned.
 - Provide for the progression of activities within the framework of individual and group interests and abilities.
 - Assist in program areas such as swimming, canoeing, horseback riding, hiking, all-camp activities, and arts and crafts as directed.
 - Plan, organize and lead campers in “dance discussion” topic of your choice (examples: nutrition, dance history, performance anxiety, etc.) at least one afternoon per session.
4. **Act as “team leader” to a group of campers.**
 - Help to inspire and lead team through team activities and competitions during each session.
 - Organize and lead “team meeting” each night after curfew.
 5. **Maintain high standards of health and safety** in all activities for campers and staff.
 - Provide the daily care of each camper within your supervision including recognition of personal health & hygiene needs.
 - Ensure that campers receive their medications as directed by Program Director and camp nurse.
 - Be alert to camper and staff needs and assist them with personal and / or health problems, and discuss with Program Director and / or camp nurse when appropriate.
 - Be alert to equipment and facilities to ensure utilization, proper care, and maintenance is adhered to; report repairs needed promptly to Program Director.
 6. **Be a role model to campers and staff** in your attitude and behavior.
 - Be accessible, responsible and a positive influence on campers throughout all facets of camp.
 - Socialize with campers and other staff members during mealtime, free time and around camp.
 - Follow and uphold all safety and security rules and procedures.
 - Set a good example for campers and others in regard to general camp procedures and practices including sanitation, schedule, and sportsmanship.

Other Job Duties:

- Contribute to verbal and written evaluations and communication as requested.
- Attend nightly all-staff meetings.
- Provide ongoing program ideas to Program Director and other ADTC staff.
- Perform any health care task beyond those assigned as needed.
- Work cooperatively with all staff employed by the facility ADTC is leasing.
- Be knowledgeable of outside health resources.
- Attend pre-camp staff training (As described in pre-interview “staff packet”).

Relationships:

- JICs report directly to ICs during dance classes and the Program Director outside of dance classes.
- JICs supervise CITs.

Equipment Used:

- Music Players (iPod speakers, karaoke machines, CD players, etc.)
- Assist campers with washers and dryers

Qualifications:

- Must be 18 or older.
- Current certification in first aid and CPR (provided by ADTC during staff training).
- High School degree preferred.
- College student with dance concentration preferred
- Must submit health history record and examination form prior to first day of camp.
- Successful completion of criminal background checks process.
- Non-US Citizens MUST have US work visa as a condition of employment.

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities:

- Must be a talented and experienced dancer capable of assisting and teaching dance classes (warm-ups, across-the-floor work, and routines to perform at the Friday Night Student Showcase).
- Must love teaching and sharing your passion for dance.
- Must be a mature, responsible, fun-loving individual.
- Must love kids and love being a positive role-model.
- Must be ready to help make ADTC a great summer experience for everybody, including yourself!

- Ability to accept supervision and guidance as well as organize and oversee activities of staff and campers.
- Ability to establish and maintain effective and productive working relationships and customer service within a diverse and multicultural environment.
- Ability to interact with all age levels.

Physical Aspects of the Position:

- Ability to communicate and work with groups participating (age and skill levels) and provide necessary instruction to campers and staff.
- Ability to observe camper behavior, assess its appropriateness, enforce appropriate safety regulations and emergency procedures, and apply appropriate behavior-management techniques.
- Ability to observe staff behavior, assess its appropriateness, enforce appropriate safety regulations and emergency procedures, and apply appropriate management techniques.
- Visual and auditory ability to identify and respond to environmental and other hazards related to the activity.
- Physical ability to respond appropriately to situations requiring first aid. Must be able to assist campers in an emergency (fire, evacuation, illness, or injury) and possess strength and endurance required to maintain constant supervision of campers.
- Endurance to walk long distances, hike, climb. etc.
- Hand-eye coordination and manual dexterity to manipulate outdoor equipment (large canoes for example) and camp activities.
- Ability to lift up to 25 lbs.
- Willing to live in a camp setting and work irregular hours with limited or simple equipment and facilities, daily exposure to the sun, heat, etc.

Junior Instructor-Counselor Compensation:

- **\$400/week** for returning JICs working all east coast or west coast sessions (plus full room & board and travel compensation between camp locations).
- **\$375/week** for returning JICs working at least two consecutive sessions (plus full room & board).
- **\$350/week** for returning JICs working one session (plus full room & board).
- **\$300/week** for all first-year JICs (plus full room & board)
- **UNPAID** for all JICs working for college credit.

** Please Note: JICs who are certified lifeguards may earn an additional \$100 per session. Please see "Lifeguard Job Description" for more information.*

Bonus Potential:

- **\$100 bonus per week** for JICs who become Certified Level 1 ADTC Instructors.
- **Earn \$30 / Hour Teaching at Local/Destination Camps Throughout the Year** – As an IC, you have the opportunity to earn additional income teaching part-time at your convenience. If you choose to also host the camp, you can earn additional income on camper tuition.
- **Camper Referral** – ICs who refer campers to ADTC earn \$100 per camper if they enroll (no limit!), plus additional compensation according to the rules below:
 - Get 4 – 6 new campers to enroll in an ADTC overnight camp session – earn \$100/camper + \$100 bonus
 - Get 7 – 10 new campers to enroll in an ADTC overnight camp session – earn \$100/camper + \$200 bonus
 - Get 10 – 20 new campers to enroll in an ADTC overnight camp session – earn \$100/camper + \$300 bonus
 - Get 20 + new campers to enroll in an ADTC overnight camp session – earn \$100/camper + \$1000 bonus
 - Grand Prize: The ADTC Employee who enrolls the most new campers will earn \$5000 cash (must be more than 20 new campers)!

ADTC 2009 Staffing Needs

Summer Overnight Camps (Stratton, VT; Squaw Valley, CA; Winter Park, CO & WCU Cullowhee, NC): Our needs will be dependent on the number of registered campers in each session. We intend to maintain a counselor-camper ratio of 1:7. As registrations continue to come in daily through the first day of camp and beyond, it is impossible for us to know definitively how many JICs per session we will need. ADTC can only promise to extend firm job offers to willing and available applicants on a rolling basis, as soon as a session's enrollment warrants additional hires.

Year-Round Dance Boot Camps (At Local Camps & Afterschool Programs throughout the US & abroad): There is no limit to the number of "on-call" JICs we can hire. Our needs will be dependent on the number of dance studios requesting boot camps, and their needs in terms of dance discipline/s & location of IC. ADTC can only promise to extend firm job offers to willing and available "on-call" ICs on a rolling basis, as soon as a dance boot camp warrants hiring.

Junior Instructor-Counselor Agreement

I understand the expectations of the Junior Instructor-Counselor position as outlined in the Junior Instructor-Counselor (JIC) job description.
